During this period, I also lead the think tank "Green phase", a four-year project financed by the Norwegian Ministry of Petroleum and Energy, and I gave lectures at NTNU. 2009-2012: Worked as a full-time teacher in arts and crafts, Norwegian, and other subjects at a secondary school.

2005-2009: Worked as Director of Trondheim Electronic Arts Centre (TEKS), developing the centre, conceptually and practically. Was responsible of funding, project development, establishing cultural initiatives, building network, developing courses and workshops etc.
